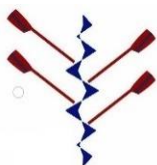

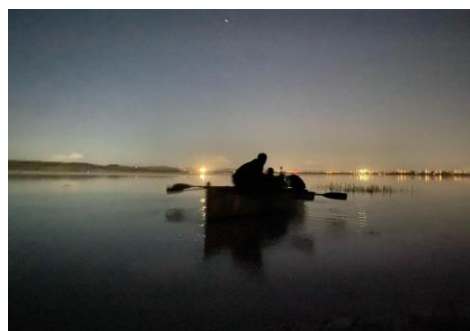

**Rowing**

The end of 2025 brought some chilly windy weather which did not deter club members from taking Shambler out on the estuary. Being able to have easy access to outdoor physical exercise and socialising with a group of people that love the water as much as I do feels very special.



At the start of December, we were blessed with a still starlit sky to row out under the light of the last cold supermoon of 2025. We grabbed the weather window, aligning tide and promise of a bright night to row. The estuary was still as we paddled out in sync. Jamie treated to baileys and coffee on the beach as we admired the water reflecting the light and shapes all around us.

The end of December brought sharp easterly winds which meant wrapping up warm and tough pulling on the oars to encourage the boat through the water against the chop. This challenged the cox to find the least exposed route, to keep the crew motivated and in time with the rise of fall of the waves. Arriving back in the calm of the mooring leads to celebratory 'well dones' as the sense of achievement sets in.

Shambler is coming out of the water at the start of January for the maintenance to begin. We have a plan of get togethers where we will do essential work to keep her safe and tidy. RYA DAY SKIPPER SHORE BASED COURSE
This Course is spread over three alternate weekends
Saturday 3rd January / Sunday 4th January
Saturday 17th January / Sunday 18th January

The course offers an introduction to chartwork, navigation and the basics of seamanship. Its goal is to help prepare you for the key decisions needed onboard to skipper a vessel in familiar waters. Students will need access to a Tablet or Laptop type device for the course

RYA SRC / VHF RADIO COURSE
Saturday 7th March
RYA Marine Radio Short Range Certificate course is a one-day course aimed at anyone who wants to operate a marine VHF radio, with or without Digital Selective Calling.

Saturday 14th March
